The Youth Exhibits operate under the General Rules and Regulations of the 2010 Pasco County Fair. The General Rules and Regulations are available upon request.

- ELIGIBILITY:**
1. All Pasco County school students (grades PK-12).
 2. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
 3. No soiled or incomplete articles will be accepted.
 4. All exhibits must have been completed since the 2009 Pasco County Fair and not exhibited before at this fair.

- ENTRIES:**
1. Participants may exhibit only one item in each class of a category but may enter all classes of the category. It is not necessary to have more than one item entered in a category to win.

REGISTRATION:

1. Articles entered for exhibition in the 2010 Youth Exhibits will be received at the fairgrounds on:
Friday, Feb. 12, between 1 and 4 p.m.
Saturday, Feb. 13, between 9 a.m. and Noon
BAKED GOODS SHOULD BE REGISTERED ON SATURDAY, FEB. 13, BETWEEN 9 A.M. AND NOON.
2. Articles cannot be picked up until Sunday, Feb. 21, from 7 to 7:30 p.m. and Monday, Feb. 22, between 9 a.m. and Noon.

JUDGING & TROPHIES:

1. Ribbons will be awarded according to the discretion of the judges. Trophies will be awarded as Grand champion of a class and an award will be given for the OUTSTANDING EXHIBIT in categories according to the discretion of the judges. Decision of the judges is final.

CATEGORY IV – COLLECTIONS

Each collection must have been made by the individual exhibiting it. Collections must be properly labeled, if possible, (common name, scientific name, date) and/or other pertinent information. Collections must be self-contained (notebook or display box). Collections may not exceed 3 square feet. Collections that were entered previously must show that their contents have increased 25% over the previous year. Example: 100 stamps exhibited last year must have a minimum of 125 stamps to be eligible this year.
